## Rapid Appeals Modernization Program (RAMP)

Present system: Legacy- one lane= VERY SLOW= 6-9 years average

New system: RAMP- VA hopes to have fully implemented by February 2019.

Three lanes= much FASTER decisions=120 days

Old System: 1. file claim

- 2. rating decision-legal jargon hard to understand
- 3. NOD
- 4. SOC (Form 9) Question ???? Should I or should I not?
- 5. SSOC (additional evidence)
- 6. Goes to BVA: A) Remand B) Grant C) Deny
- 7. Court of Appeals
- 8. Federal Court
- 9. Supreme Court

New System: 1. File claim

- 2. rating decision-Enhancement Notice: 1 year to respond.
  - a) what veteran has done correctly.
  - b) what specific information or evidence the veteran needs to provide for a favorable outcome.
- 3. If denied, you have 3 choices or 3 lanes to choose from:
  - a) Higher Level Review Lane- ONLY EVIDENCE ALREASY SUBMITTED
    results in new decision
  - b) Supplemental Claim Lane- if you have or need new evidence. VA looks at the evidence and issues a decision.

c) NOD Lane- lengthy process is "removed". No "statement of the case" needs to be submitted. Goes straight to BVA

If BVA rules unfavorably , and you gather new evidence, you can go back into the Supplemental Claim Lane and your effective date remains the same.

If you submit a fully developed claim and you choose the Higher Level Review Lane, you could have a decision within 120 days.

MAJOR CONSIDERATION: If you decide to go from Legacy to RAMP and then change you mind, you CANNOT go back to Legacy.

ALSO: AT THIS TIME, the NOD lane is not opened. Will not be an option until Feb. 2019. \*\*\*\*\* No "face to face"

**Who was chosen to op in?** Those who have been waiting the longest=Form 9, SSOCs **General Information:** 1. 20,000 initially asked to opt in. 3% chose to do so.

("fear of the unknown" or "leap of faith")

- 2. 2/3s chose Higher Level Review; 1/3 chose Supplemental
- 3. Legacy grant rate=25%; RAMP grant rate=61%\*\*\* Full vs. Non-compensable
